"Truly Living"

You haven't truly lived until you have _____

How would you fill in the blank? ... Tried a different food? Visited a particular vacation spot? Experienced some unique activity?

Saint Paul has his own answer to fill in the blank above:

¹⁷ Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. ¹⁸ Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. ¹⁹ In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life (1 Timothy 6:17-19 ESV).

You haven't truly lived until you so look forward to the fullness of eternal life with God that you are willing to part with everything that may distract from that eternal future. Doing so, Paul says, you "take hold of the life that is truly life."

So much of what occupies the living of our everyday life isn't really life—not the kind of life God wants for each of us. The daily "rat race." Keeping up with the Joneses. The worries about what we have or don't have. Maintaining our spot on the social ladder (or working our way up to that next rung). How much of our time and energy is spent on these things? Is this the sum total of life and living?

On Easter Sunday, when we sing and shout our "alleluias," we are praising God for the life that includes the happiness and successes of this life on earth but goes so much farther than the here-and-now. Christ our Savior has opened the doors of eternity to us. This is no short-lived victory. This is not simply a change in status for a period of months, days, or years. This is the total, complete reversal of sin and its effects through Jesus' own cross and empty tomb. All that causes death and destruction in this world are themselves destroyed. Easter makes permanent our experience of all that is good and right and joy-filled.

Paul tells Timothy (and us!) to grab ahold of this life that Jesus wins for us. Grab onto this life with both hands. Let go of those things that can provide only temporary happiness. Deprioritize those things that may satisfy us for today but will do nothing for us tomorrow. Jesus' cross and empty tomb usher us into an experience of richness that knows no limits and no end. It's already yours by faith in Jesus Christ. Own it today with all your heart, soul, mind and strength!

Happy Easter! Happy living-truly living!

Carrying a Butterfly

"Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." Ephesians 4:32 (NIV)

A neat thing about living along the Gulf Coast is that every September, I get to see swarms of Gulf fritillaries. We have their host plant, the passion vine, growing along our fence line. As the whimsical purple flower open toward the sun, the butterflies seem to come from north, south, east and west. Then they lay eggs, and a new generation of butterflies is born. I love watching the orange caterpillars, with their menacing black spikes, and the beautiful butterflies they become.

Last week, a cold front came through and brought with it some heavy winds. My son and I were playing outside during a break in the rain, and as we were running, I noticed an old butterfly with worn wings climbing up a tall blade of grass amid the storm. I reached out with care, and it climbed onto my finger. Naturally, I thought about keeping it forever, but instead, I used my other hand to block the wind from its wings while I searched for a better spot in the yard for the butterfly. I settled on a thick bush full of flowers, where it could get nectar and burrow between the leaves as needed between gusts of wind.

The butterfly immediately unrolled its wings and began to drink from the flower, as I stood in awe that for the second time in two weeks, a butterfly had crawled into my hand. I thought about how a similar principle holds true with the people around me. Sometimes, when the winds of life pick up, others who are struggling may be more apt to accept encouragement or help. I hope and pray that I'm able to see them and take the opportunity to block the wind for a little while. May I always remember the difference I can make in other' lives.

February was a busy month with school, but I feel like I have finally settled into a routine. One of my favorite things this month was watching my kids fall in love with Jesus. Every Wednesday Poetice runs a prayer set, which is a time of prayer and worship, and we always bring the students. It is always so interesting to watch my kids in this environment, as many of them are just beginning to learn what worship is and how they can connect with Jesus through worship and prayer. So, it isn't unusual to see many of the students standing there, seemingly uninterested or not connecting with the prayer set. However, I have begun to see my kids connect with God a little bit at a time as we have prayer and worship every Wednesday. I have seen one boy kneel in worship, another pray over the microphone, and others raise their hands to God. This is truly the greatest privilege and the biggest reason why I am here - to help these kids grow to know God and how much He loves them.



On February 19th we had our first Youth House meeting of the year, which was an absolute blast! I am part of a small group that helps to run Youth House as well as one of the many group leaders. We celebrated our first day back by fellowshipping and playing some games. Some of these games I know and have played before, such as dodge ball, and others were new to me, such as a game where you have to ride on a partner's back while throwing a ball around and trying not to drop it. It was such a bast and it was SO good to be back with these youth from the community. I am excited to see what God has in store for Youth House this year.

We are moving into our house *next weekend*! This is so exciting as well as stressful. I have attached a picture of our house for you all to see - it is a beautiful house surrounded by several fruit trees (guava, mango, pomegranate, and lime). So cool! Living on base has been good, but I am excited to have a place to really call "home" here in Zambia.

Like I said, it is also stressful; I never thought my first time "adulting" would be in Africa, but here we are. I am learning all about solar panels (which we have purchased and installed on our house - yay!!! Thank you all for donating so that we are able to have this reliable source of electricity), how to buy quality appliances in Choma, and the fact that houses don't come with things like curtains, pots and pans, or rugs already in them - you actually have to buy all of these things yourself! All jokes aside, this is a very exciting step into really building my life here in Choma.



Prayer Requests

I have been quite stressed this past month as I have been very busy with school and somewhat overwhelmed, still, with figuring out how to teach 6-9 year olds and have the patience for this. At the beginning of my time here this year, I had intended to spend time with God every day after school. However, as often happens, I often was "too busy" to do this. I had a very convicting realization the other day in regards to all of this - I came to Zambia because I wanted to follow what God was calling me to do and I wanted to share His love with the people here. The main reason I came here was for God - and yet, I was pushing my time with Him aside so that I was able to get all of these things done that I was "doing for Him." Wow. I realized how wrong this was, and how this might be a large reason why I was struggling so much this month - I was busy doing all of these things *for God*, but not being *with Him*. So, this month I decided that that will change. While I really hate waking up early, I am going to wake up a little bit earlier so that I can prioritize spending time with the Lord before anything else in my day. Please pray that I would be vigilant in keeping this commitment to spending more time with God and that it would bring me more peace and patience in the classrom.
